Touring 20 cathedrals, it consists of 12 beautiful silk panels, each nearly 3m high, re-imagining the story of creation from the Bible. It appeals to people of all ages and backgrounds and is very family friendly. If you've read Genesis in black and white, see the truly breathtaking story in glorious colour with dramatic and complex designs. It's one of the largest textile art projects ever undertaken by a single artist and took Christian artist Jacqui Parkinson 3 years and 8,000,000 stitches to complete.
